WYOMING – CLIMATE

Wyoming is generally semiarid, with local desert conditions. Normal daily temperatures in Cheyenne range from 15°F (−9°C) to 38°F (3°C) in January, and 55°F (13°C) to 82°F (28°C) in July. The record low temperature, −66°F (−54°C), was set 9 February 1933 at Riverside; the record high, 114°F (46°C), 12 July 1900 at Basin. In Cheyenne, average annual precipitation (1971–2000) was 15.5 in (39.4 cm) a year, most of that falling between March and September; the snowfall in Cheyenne averages 56 in (142 cm) annually.

- **Cheyenne Frontier Days Old West Museum- Cheyenne, WY**
 - Learn about the history of Cheyenne and the Old West at this engaging museum which exhibits antique horse-drawn carriages, wagons and early automobiles, among other artifacts and memorabilia related to the region.
- **The Merci Train- Cheyenne, WY**
 - This train was a gift from the French in appreciation for the American Friendship Train that supplied food to the French during World War II. On its "thank you" tour, the Merci Train deposited a boxcar full of presents at each state capital.
- **Tate Geological Museum- Casper, WY**
 - The Tate Geological Museum was founded in 1980 through a gift from Marion and Inez Tate. Located on the Casper College campus, the museum is a great resource to the community. Many local schools and groups come to the museum to add to their students learning experience. One of a minute number of geology and paleontology museums in Wyoming, the Tate houses a collection of over 3000 fossil and mineral specimens. Museum staff are always on hand to answer questions, help identify items visitors bring in, and make your visit to the museum an enjoyable experience. The Tate is certainly a great addition to anyone's list of 'must see sites' when traveling through Wyoming.
- **Nicolaysen Art Museum- Casper, WY**
 - The NIC provides a place to educate, stimulate, and promote the understanding of art so that people can meet, view, study, create and enjoy contemporary art of the Rocky Mountain Region. They offer nine galleries with contemporary works of art from regional artists as well as hands on art activity center, which we call the Discovery Center. There is no admission charge to our museum thanks to our generous sponsors. Come discover the artistic wealth of the Rocky Mountain region!
- **Bighorn National Forest- Sheridan, WY**
 - Located in north-central Wyoming, the Bighorn Mountains are a sister range of the Rocky Mountains. Conveniently located halfway between Mt. Rushmore and Yellowstone National Park, the Bighorns are a great vacation destination in themselves. No region in Wyoming is provided with a more diverse landscape - from lush grasslands to alpine meadows, from crystal-clear lakes to glacially-carved valleys, from rolling hills to sheer mountain walls. .

- **Fort Phil Kearny State Historic Site- Sheridan, WY**
 - Fort Phil Kearny was one of 3 U.S. Army forts established along the Bozeman Trail in 1866. Named after deceased Civil War General Philip Kearny (pronounced Car-Knee) the fort's mission was to protect travelers along the Bozeman Trail against Indian attack. Fort Phil Kearny was burned by the Indians when the Army abandoned it in 1868. Today you can visit the fort grounds and enjoy the scenery of the surrounding hills that has changed little in the past 147yrs. There is also a visitor's center with a small museum with fort and Indian artifacts, and a bookstore.

- **Adobe Town- Rock Springs, WY**
 - Adobe Town was inhabited by indigenous people as far back as 12,000 years ago, and is still considered a part of the ancestral homeland of the Shoshone tribe. Adobe Town was first documented by white explorers during the Geological Exploration of the 40th Parallel in 1869. Today, a little less than half of the lands that qualify for wilderness status receive strong protection as a Wilderness Study Area. The entire 180,910 acres of the citizens' proposed wilderness was designated as Very Rare or Uncommon by the State of Wyoming in 2007, which protects the area from strip mining but leaves it vulnerable to oil and gas drilling activities, which are currently encroaching on the area. For more than a decade, BCA has led the charge to fight off drilling in this fragile desert environment and give it the long-term protection it deserves.

- **Rockpile Museum- Gillette, WY**
 - This small museum serves as a local history center for Campbell County and northeast Wyoming. Open 9-5 Mon.thru Sat. Free. Mining videos here are interesting. 307-682-5723. Exhibits include regional artifacts, and this museum serves as a local history center for Campbell County and northeast Wyoming.

- **Jackson Hole Aerial Tram Rides- Jackson Hole, WY**
 - This is what flying feels like. In 15 minutes, the Aerial Tram glides 4,139 vertical feet from the base of Teton Village to the top of Rendezvous Mountain. The summit offers a staggering 360-degree view of the Snake River Valley, Grand Teton National Park and the Gros Ventre Range in the distance. Even the summit of the Grand feels close from this high up. Hiking trails lace the summit, offering access to the wilderness that lies just beyond the resort's boundaries – a world populated by wildflowers, pine trees and high-alpine lakes. On the summit, stumble upon geology; many people find fossils from the ancient oceans that once covered Jackson Hole.
